Please note, that on the sign-up website, some of the items on the sign-up website have a shortened description due to the limitations of the website. Therefore, you may need to refer back to these details about the item on this document when purchasing. Thank you!

DEPARTMENT: General DEPOT Supplies

1. **Rolled Bandages. Instructions:** Widths should be 3", 4" and 5". The diameter of the bandage when rolled should be 2-3". Be sure and secure the end of the bandage with a stitch, or a torn long piece of material (not rubber bands or ribbons). - 2500
2. **O.R./ Maternity Table Covers. Instructions:** Use flat cotton or cotton/polyester sheets, Twin or Full size, any solid color. Fold sheet in half so it is 48" x 66" (twin) or 48"x 81" (full). Zig-zag close to the edge around the entire doubled sheet, including the folded side. Then measure half way down (33" or 40.1") and sew across the sheet. – 100
3. **Sterilization Wraps. Instructions:** Finished sizes wanted are **36" x 36", 48 x 48" and 60" x 60". No small ones needed at this time.** **Instructions:** You can make them out of gently used cotton or cotton/polyester fabric or sheets, or even old cloth tablecloths. (Don't use flannel as it is too loose a weave). Blue, green or white solid colors are preferred though other colors are accepted. (They can be pieced together if you don't have enough fabric to make these sizes). To make them, cut two layers of fabric 1 inch larger than the finished size. Pin and sew around all 4 sides using ½ inch seam, leaving an opening for turning. Turn right-side out, press, then topstitch around the entire square. Finally, sew a diagonal line from corner to corner, creating an X. – 36 x 36 – need 100, 48 x 48 – need 100, 60 x 60 – need 20
4. **Mayo stand covers. Instructions:** use flat, white bedsheets (not flannel) to make what are essentially long pillowcases but are double-thickness. When finished and laid flat, they should measure approximately 23"x 55". (See sewing instruction link above) - 30
5. **Eye drapes for surgery. Instructions:** Could use up to 30. *use flat, white bedsheets (not flannel) to make double-thickness rectangles about 36"x48", with a 2.5" circular hole that is at the middle of the 36" dimension and 1/3 of the total longer dimension.* See sewing instruction link above - 36

6. Cotton or Cotton/Polyester Scrubs – 200 medium, 100 large, 40 XL (nothing larger than XL, no XS)
7. Khaki scrubs for janitorial staff – 10 large, 50 medium
8. Long-sleeved button-down scrub tops, 25 each of S, M, L, XL

9. White lab coats for doctors - 25
10. Hand towels, darker colors preferred – 100+
11. Washcloths, darker colors preferred – 200+
12. Patient gowns – adult – *please do not send any at this time*
13. Patient gowns – child – *please do not send any at this time*
14. Scrub dresses for women SS (laundry staff) – 5 medium, 5 large
15. Twin bed sheet sets for patient beds – 100 sets

1. Bi-pap machines for rescue breathing – 6
2. Bi-pap face masks or nasal masks - 12
3. Defibrillator - 3
4. Lumbar puncture kits for adults - 20
5. Suction machine – 1 or 2
6. Good quality 1-inch masking tape (used to secure sterilization packages). 50 rolls. IDEALLY STERILIZATION/AUTOCLAVE TAPE
7. Non-sterile gloves, medium size, 100 boxes of 100
8. 50 ml. Monoject syringes - 30
9. 50 ml. BD IV syringes - 50
10. 50 ml. BD NG syringes 50
11. 50 ml. BRAUN IV syringes - 100
12. 50 ml. BRAUN enteral syringes - 100
13. 60 cc irrigation syringes - 50
14. Kerlix-type bandages and dressings – 4 large boxes
15. Blood pressure cuffs, 15 digital and 5 manual

DEPARTMENT: MEDICATIONS (OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATIONS)

!!!! Make sure they will not expire in 12 months !!!!

1. Small pill baggies, with AM, PM and other printed on the baggie – 2000
2. Small pill bottles - 1000
3. Famotidine (antacid) 20 mg pills – 200-count bottles – 5
4. Adult Multivitamins with essential minerals like Centrum and Cerovite (the kind that can be cut into quarters easily, not the gum-ball shaped ones). For adult – 200 bottles
5. Kids Multivitamins with essential minerals like Centrum Kids or Cerovite Jr (the kind that can be cut into quarters easily, not the gum-ball shaped ones). For kids – 300 bottles
6. Multivitamins for children GUMMY – 10 bottles
7. Benadryl (generic name is Diphenhydramine Hydrochloride) in tablets (not capsules). Generic is fine. – 1000 pills
8. Benadryl for kids (in suspension) – 300 bottles
9. Antacids with Calcium like Rolaids or Tums – 200 bottles
10. Aspirin 325 mg – 5000 pills
11. Tubes of Diclofenac gel (anti-inflammatory) - 25
12. MiraLAX powder – 25 bottles
13. Lactulose liquid – 20 bottles
14. Pepto-Bismol – 2,500 tablets

15. Omeprazole – 2,500 tablets
16. Infant saline nose drops – 60 bottles
17. Selsun or Selsun Blue Shampoo (make sure it has Selenium Sulfide 1% as active ingredient) – 20 bottles
18. Ear Wax removal ear drops – 10 bottles
19. Antibiotic cream like polysporin – 100
20. Vitamin B6 (pyridoxine) 18,000 pills for 100 TB patients per year X 180 days (one per day each).

DEPARTMENT: EYE CLINIC SUPPLIES

1. Artificial tears (lubricating drops in bottles)
Nothing with tetrahydrazoline or naphazoline or phenylephrine listed in the ingredients, nor anything that says “red out” - 1000
2. Artificial tears (lubricant) in little plastic vials in boxes, preservative-free, 100 boxes
3. Variety of reading glasses – total 1000
4. Sunglasses (patients really like the wide earpiece style, women like sparkles)
5. Muro128 ophthalmic ointment (if you can't find the ointment, drops are fine). The generic (sodium chloride 5% ophthalmic ointment) is equivalent and may be cheaper – 175
6. Pen lights with batteries – 30
7. 5 cc syringes MUST be “luerlocked” - 500
8. Non-sterile gloves, medium size, 20 boxes of 100
9. Tissues (Kleenex) – 40 boxes
10. Sharpie markers with “fine” tip, black. (~~Not the “very fine” tip.~~) – *please do not send any at this time*
11. Small toys for pediatric patients. – *not needed right now*

DEPARTMENT: SURGERY

1. Surgical blue towels, 27” long, 6-pack – 4
2. 2” surgical paper tape - 40
3. 4” x 4” gauze – 3000
4. ABD pads – 500
5. Hypafix type tape 2”x10 yards – 12 rolls
6. Vaseline. Generic ok. – 25 jars
7. Chest tube collection cannisters (pleurevacs-NOT glass jars)- 40
8. Vaseline impregnated gauze – 1 box
9. Pediatric chest tubes (size 12-16 French) - 40
10. Jackson Pratt wound drain collection bulbs - 40
11. Wound drains 14 French or larger - 40
12. Any unexpired sutures – unlimited
13. Adhesive dressing such as Tegaderm or ioban – 2 boxes
14. Fiberglass casting tape: 1” – 20, 2”- 40, 3”- 100, 6” – 100,

DEPARTMENT: OB/GYN

1. Chux pads – 1000
2. LifeDop or HI Bebe Fetal dopplers, 3mHz – 2
3. LifeDop or HI Bebe Fetal dopplers, 2mHz - 3
4. 8” or longer cotton swabs (Q-tips) - 400
5. Probe covers (condoms work and are less expensive) – 250
6. Kiwi vacuum delivery system – ok if expired or opened but unused - 20
7. Pre-natal vitamins – containing at least **iron, folate and calcium (not gummy, not soft gel, hard tablets only)** – 500 bottles

DEPARTMENT: MATERNITY

1. Bulb syringes – 350
2. Cloth reusable incontinence bed pads, about size 34” x 36”. Look up on the internet to find these. (See North Shore Care Supply on the internet) - 40
3. Disinfectant wipes – 50 packages

4. Ultrasound gel (Aquasonic 100 Ultrasonic Gel, 250ml) – 50 bottles
5. Baby bottles BPA free - 50
6. Pacifiers, 50 regular size, 25 preemie
7. Preemie-sized disposable diapers. Please don't open the packages. – 30 packages

DEPARTMENT: NURSING SCHOOL

1. Wristwatches, analog, not digital, with dial and must have second hand—10 women's, 10 men's
2. Stethoscopes (not cheap ones – Littmann Classic III is good)—need 20
3. Pulse oximeters - 20

DEPARTMENT: DENTAL SUPPLIES

1. Amalgamator - 4
2. Curing light - 4
3. Autoclave - 2
4. Compressor and aspirator – 1 (or one each separately)
5. Cavitron - 5
6. Zinc oxide and Eugenol (IRM - Intermediate Restorative Material) – 10 bottles
7. Gelfoam – 10 bottles
8. Composite A1 - 10
9. Composite A2 - 10
10. Bonding single bond – 20 bottles
11. Prophylaxis paste - 10
12. Surgical burs - 20
13. Amalgam – 500 capsules
14. Calcium Hydroxide – 10 boxes (2 tubes per box)
15. Low speed handpiece - 4
16. Alginate – 10 bags
17. Rubber model base – 5 large
18. Dental surgical sutures – 5 boxes of 10
